WHO

This specialised osteology course is for students of archaeology, anthropology, and related disciplines. It is an excellent introduction to the study of human remains in archaeology.

HOW

Option 1 The osteology course, consists of a series of lectures and laboratory work. Students will have the opportunity to examine and identify different types of bones and discover the wealth of information they contain.

Option 2 is designed to give the student a broad understanding of Irish Archaeology with illustrated lectures and field trips to inspire those with an interest in Ireland's past.



WHAT

Option 1 an Introduction to Human Osteology in Archaeology, is a two week course, where students will learn the skills to interpret human remains in an archaeological context, and gain an insight to the individual's circumstances and environment, before and after death. Successful students will be able to:

- o distinguish between human and animal remains
- o determine age, sex & stature
- o recognise malformations and effects of disease

Option 2 is designed to give the student a broad understanding of 'Irish Archaeology', including the Archaeology of Death, and will include lectures, field trips, guest lecturers and will cover a broad-range of topics in Irish archaeology from Neolithic to post-medieval periods.

NOTE: These courses can be taken concurrently.



RESOURCES

The course will be led by Laureen Buckley, one of Ireland's leading osteologists. The course is based at our purpose-built post-excavation facility in Kells, Co. Meath. The premises include dedicated areas for research, lectures, and laboratory analysis, and are fully furnished with storage, canteen, washrooms and reception facilities.
